Sunday 20 April - Eighth Day Pesach

Shacharit	9.15am
Yizkor, approx.	10.45am
Mincha followed by shiur	7.56pm
Yom Tov ends and Ma'ariv begins	8.56pm

¹ A Siyum is a completion of study of a tractate of Talmud. First-born males are obligated to fast the day before Pesach in commemoration of the miracle when they were saved from the plague of the firstborn. Attendance at a Siyum exempts firstborn males from fasting on this day, although they should be careful not to eat or drink until they attend the Siyum.
